

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

- 1 The name of the school is **Bishop Wood Church of England Junior School Tring**.
- 2 The school is a voluntary aided school.
- 3 The name of the governing body is **the Governing Body of Bishop Wood Church of England Junior School Tring**.
- 4 The governing body shall consist of:
 - (a) two parent governors
 - (b) one LA governor
 - (c) one head teacher
 - (d) one staff governor
 - (e) eight foundation governors
 - (f) one co-opted governor
- 5 The total number of governors is 14.
- 6 The foundation governors shall comprise
 - (a) one ex officio governor as in 7(a)
 - (b) seven appointed as follows:
 - (i) two by the Diocesan Board of Education
 - (ii) five by the District Church Council in whose parish and district the school is situated
- 7
 - (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio: the principal officiating minister of the parish in which the school is situated.
 - (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex officio governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which the governorship exists, or has been removed from office under regulation 23(2) of the Regulations.
- 8 The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated may, in consultation with the Diocesan Director of Education, request the removal of the ex officio foundation governor and may appoint any substitute governor.
- 9 The ethos of the school is:

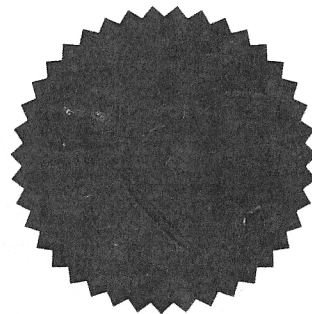
Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

- 11 This instrument of government comes into effect on 1 September 14.
- 12 This instrument was made by order of Hertfordshire County Council on 25 July 2014.
- 13 A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
