This Week in Staff Meeting

How Can Teachers Help Children Commit Information to Long-Term Memory?

The teaching team studied working memory limitations and reflected on teaching adaptations moving forward. We discussed the importance of concise explanations to avoid cognitive overload and explored strategies to help pupils think meaningfully about new ideas, aiding long-term memory retention. Activities designed to prompt deeper thinking and connect new concepts to prior knowledge were highlighted as most effective.

We also considered how to motivate and engage pupils, focusing on fostering curiosity and meaningful connections. Practical ideas included using guided tasks and prompts to encourage thoughtful engagement with learning. Willingham's Simple Memory Model
