### **Mobile Phones!**

At Bishop Wood, we do not encourage pupils to bring mobile phones into school. However, we understand that parents may choose to send older children in with them for safety reasons when travelling to and from school. If you want your Year 5 or 6 child to bring their phone to school, a Mobile Phone Agreement must be signed and returned to their class teacher. These can be found on our website as part of the Mobile Phone Policy. Mobiles must be turned off before entering the school grounds and given to the class teacher who will lock them away until the end of the day. They must then remain turned off until the child has left the school site. As stated in the agreement, children who do not follow the guidelines will face having their mobile phone confiscated and a parent will be called to pick it up from the school office.
