Remember reading should be fun. Choose a book that interests you. Read the Blurb it will help you decide.

How to choose 'Just Right' books

Remember reading should be **fun**. Choose a book that interests **you**. Look at the cover Read the title and the author Read the Blurb on the back Use the **Five Finger Rule**

Think about the *5 Finger Rule* when choosing a book. Read one page and hold up a finger for each word you can't figure out.

- **5** fingers held up means its too hard and you should choose a different book or ask someone to read it to you.
- **4** fingers means the book might be too challenging perhaps read it with a friend or adult.
- **3** fingers mean it is challenging but give it a try.
- 2 fingers it's just right for you. Enjoy!
- **1** finger means it's easy to read maybe try something more challenging next time.

Now and again try a new style of book or a new author. If you don't like it first time try again in a few months you may feel differently.

Authors marked with a * are highly recommended and have written many more books than appear on the list, give them a try.

Almost all these books can be found on the Fiction shelves at Bishop Wood School but if you are having trouble locating them speak to Mrs Lloyd or ask at Tring Library. Tring Library will order any book for you for free and borrowing is free.

This list is by no means complete. If you have read something you think is great and you would like to see it added to the list so others can enjoy it too, come and tell Mrs Lloyd about it or write a short review and hand it to your teacher or Mrs Lloyd.
