
Reading


- Daily Whole Class Reading sessions- VIPERS
- Little Wandle Phonics groups
- Individual Reading Books- Big Cat Books- We will assess your child's reading regularly and encourage them to select and change their books independently.
- Boom Reader rewards- Children are encouraged and expected to read 3 times each week at home. Please log reads on Boom Reader. Awards are given for attaining bronze (25), silver (50) gold (75) and platinum (100 reads).

Spellings


Each week we learn a different spelling pattern. Your child will bring home 10 words as part of their weekly home learning which use this pattern.

Children are given time during the school day to practice their spellings to help consolidate learning and help them feel more confident in to use them accurately in their independent writing.

Maths Curriculum

Our Maths lessons are engaging, fun and practical. We aim to encourage children to be confident mathematicians who can apply their learning and solve problems.

We will be revising the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and introducing the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.









Science Curriculum

The children will use a variety of approaches to answer relevant scientific questions. They include observing over time, pattern seeking, identifying, classifying and grouping, fair testing, and researching using secondary sources. Working scientifically skills are embedded in each






PSHE

Rewards are organised throughout the year as houses reach a given number of house points.


House sports events run throughout the year where house points can be won through team activities.
