Morning activities



We start each day with a guided group session. Once a week your child will work with their class teacher in a small group reading and discussing a range of texts or working on comprehension skills.

Meanwhile, the other groups will be expected to work independently on a variety of clearly defined tasks that support the development of reading comprehension.

Reading Records



At Bishop Wood, we have an exciting reading system where children can earn rewards for their reads. We encourage and expect your child to read at least 3 times each week. Children will receive a tick on the front of their Reading Record after 3 reads and can build up to attaining bronze, silver and gold awards.

Your child should bring their Reading Record to school each day so that it can be filled in when they read with an adult.

We will assess your child's reading at the beginning of the year and then encourage them to select and change their books independently.

English Curriculum

Throughout the year we will read a variety of books, exposing the children to creative ideas and vocabulary. We will use these as a stimulus to produce work on the following genres:

- Traditional fables
- Traditional fairy tales
- Adventure stories
- Plays
- Recounts
- Instructions
- Non-chronological reports
- Persuasive writing
- Different styles of poetry

English Curriculum

Spellings

Each week we learn a different spelling pattern. Your child will bring home 10 words as part of their weekly home learning which use this spelling pattern. There is a weekly spelling test before learning new spellings.


We create a time most days for children to practice their spellings to help consolidate the learning and help them feel more confident to use them accurately in their independent writing.

Maths Curriculum

Our maths lessons are engaging, fun and practical. Our aim is to encourage the children to be confident mathematicians who can apply their learning and solve problems.

➢ We will be revising the 2, 5 and 10 times tables as well as introducing the children to the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Science Curriculum

The children will use a variety of approaches to answer relevant scientific questions.

They include observing over time, pattern seeking, identifying, classifying and grouping, fair testing and researching using secondary sources.

Working scientifically is not taught as a separate strand but through the topics that each year group teach.

Home Learning


Each Friday we set some home learning tasks. This will be due in the following Thursday. All homework is set on Google Classroom with clear instructions.

House System


Your child will be allocated a house for their time at Bishop Wood.



Children can earn house points throughout the school day for positive behaviour and attitude towards their learning.

Rewards are organised throughout the year as houses reach a given number of house points.

House sports events run throughout the year where house points can be won through team activities. Each Friday you will receive a weekly newsletter which will celebrate the weekly successes of the school as well as give you a comprehensive update of dates and forthcoming events.





To Prepare for September

Uniform:

- School sweatshirt or cardigan with logo
- Pale blue polo shirt with logo
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- Black school shoes, not boots
- White, grey or navy socks/tights
- Wellies for the field when it is wet
- Water proof trousers for when it is really wet

P.E. Kit:

Some other polite reminders

- Long hair needs to be tied back
- The children should not wear jewellery in school. If they have pierced ears they may only wear small stud earrings which MUST be removed or taped over for P.E
- The children will not need a pencil case as all equipment is provided by school
- As the children are now in Junior School, the government nolonger provide a free fruit snack. Children are invited to bring a healthy snack for morning play which they will eat in the playground.
- All children need a named water bottle
- PLEASE remember to NAME EVERYTHING, especially school shoes.
